### *Fourth Annual CLE Forum on November 18*

INDIANAPOLIS (September 30, 2011) — The fourth annual Court History Symposium, "Civil Rights in the Southern District," will be presented on Friday, November 18, 2011, at the Birch Bayh Federal Building and United States Court House, 46 East Ohio Street. The program will be held in the William E. Steckler Ceremonial Courtroom (Courtroom 202).

Sponsored by the Historical Society of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Indiana, the three-hour Continuing Legal Education forum (approval of credit pending) will be held from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The event will feature presentations from:

- Joseph H. Hogsett, United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, speaking about significant civil rights cases to come before the Southern District
- Federal Public Defender William E. Marsh and attorneys David R. Day, John L. Wood, and John S. Chappell speaking about their personal involvement in and reflections on the Indianapolis Public Schools' busing case
- District Judge Tanya Walton Pratt and Magistrate Judge Denise K. LaRue on the role of the independence of the judiciary and the rule of law in the Indianapolis Public Schools' busing case
