U.S. FOREST SERVICE AND NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM OFFENSES COLLATERAL FORFEITURE SCHEDULE FEDERAL RULES OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE -- RULE 58(d)(1)

Mandatory Appearances. Law enforcement officers with authority to make arrests and issue Violation Notices for offenses against the United States may exercise the discretion to require a defendant's mandatory appearance before the presiding United States Magistrate Judge when, in that officer's judgment, the offense is of an aggravated nature. Recidivism, failure to comply upon notice, and serious public safety offenses may be considered by the citing officer. Additionally, when restitution to the United States or any other victim exceeds the value of fines and restitution pursuant to this collateral forfeiture schedule, mandatory appearance may be considered. Nothing herein shall prohibit the law enforcement officer from arresting a person for the commission of any offense against the United States, including those for which collateral may be posted in lieu of appearance.

<u>Organizations</u>. Due to increased liability and potential for severe environmental degradation posed by commercial and organized activities, the collateral amounts for violations listed herein committed by an organization shall be doubled. Organization includes a corporation, government or government agency, business, trust, estate, partnership, association, church, club, hunting club, or any other legal entity where two or more persons have a joint or common interest.

<u>Restitution Valuation</u>. Where "+" is noted after the collateral amount, restitution may be added to that collateral amount. Refer to the valuation table to determine restitution amounts for natural resource offenses.



After National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and areas on National Forest System lands have been designated pursuant to 36 CFR 212.51 on an administrative unit or a Ranger District of the National Forest System, and these designations have been identified on a motor vehicle use map, it is prohibited to possess or operate a motor vehicle on National Forest System lands in that administrative unit or Ranger District other than in accordance with those designations, provided that the following vehicles and uses are exempted from this prohibition:

(a) Aircraft; (b) Watercraft; (c) Over-snow vehicles; (d) Limited administrative use by the Forest Service; (e) Use of any fire, military, emergency, or law enforcement vehicle for emergency purposes; (f) Authorized use of any combat or combat support vehicle for national defense purposes; (g) Law enforcement response to violations of law, including pursuit; (h) Motor vehicle use that is specifically authorized under a written authorization issued under Federal law or regulations; and (i) Use of a road or trail that is authorized by a legally documented right-of-way held by a State, county, or other local public road authority.

36 CFR 261.14 USE BY OVER-SNOW VEHICLES.

It is prohibited to possess or operate an over-snow vehicle on National Forest System lands in violation of a restriction or prohibition established pursuant to 36 CFR part 212, subpart C, provided that the following uses are exempted from this section:

(a) Limited administrative use by the Forest Service; (b) Use of any fire, military, emergency, or law enforcement vehicle for emergency purposes; (c) Authorized use of any combat or combat support vehicle for national defense purposes; (d) Law enforcement response to violations of law, including pursuit; (e) Use by over-snow vehicles that is specifically authorized under a written authorization issued under Federal law or regulations; and (f) Use of a road or trail that is authorized by a legally documented right-of-way held by a State, county, or other local public road authority.
