ORDER

At its meeting on September 23, 1997, the Judicial Conference of the United States issued a formal policy pertaining to pro hac vice admission fees and periodic admission renewals. The Judicial Conference determined that:

- (a) the attorney admission fee prescribed in the District Court Miscellaneous Fee Schedule, promulgated pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1914(b), does not apply to pro hac vice requests or renewals of attorney admission to practice;
- (b) local courts may charge, at their option, a local fee above the original admission of attorneys to practice before this court;
- (c) local courts may charge, at their option, a fee for pro hac vice admissions and for renewals of an attorney's admission to practice; and
- (d) revenues from local fees may be deposited into a District Court's Library Fund for the benefit of the bar and the administration of justice.

Accordingly, to further the benefit of the bar and the administration of justice, the court has determined that the attorney admission fee in this District shall be \$231, with \$181 of that fee to be deposited into the U.S. Treasury and \$50 to be deposited into this Court's Library Fund. The Court also has established a fee of \$100 per request to be admitted pro hac vice, with such fee in its entirety to be deposited into the Court's Library Fund. The modification of fees as set forth herein shall be effective **December 1**, 2016.
