GENERAL ORDER


On May 25, 2021, the Court issued General Order 2021-14 which, among other things, permitted individuals who have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to enter and occupy certain courthouse spaces without wearing a face covering. With respect to persons summoned for jury service, Section 7 of General Order 2021-14 required those persons and Court staff interacting with them to wear a face covering and to maintain social distancing engaged in juror check-in, orientation, and related activities.

The Court has determined that social distancing in the context of juror check-in, orientation, and related activities is no longer necessary. Accordingly, the requirement for social distancing in Item 7 of General Order 2021-14 is lifted. In all other respects General Order 2021-14 remains in full force and effect.
