Each of these guests will provide their own perspectives on the challenges and rewards of serving in the legal field in a time of demonstrations, protests, and mistrust of law enforcement.

Musical entertainment will be provided by Chris Wilburn, a retired Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department sergeant and classically trained opera singer. Mr. Wilburn has previously performed at Colts games and alongside the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra.

As in past years, the 2023 program is co-sponsored by the United States District Court, Bankruptcy Court, Probation Office, United States Attorney's Office, Federal Community Defenders, and the United States Marshals Service for the Southern District of Indiana.
