GENERAL ORDER

To the extent this Order differs from previous orders of the Court on this subject, this Order supersedes and replaces those orders.

On March 13, 2020, the United States District Court for the Southern District of Indiana issued a General Order concerning Court Operations Under the Exigent Circumstances Created by COVID-19 and Related Coronavirus. In that Order, the Court noted that current court operations present substantial health risks to the public and reduced certain Court operations as deemed appropriate at that time. The COVID-19 situation has continued to intensify and risks to the public, Court personnel, and the orderly administration of justice are increasing.

In light of the rapidly evolving situation presented by the COVID-19 pandemic and the increasing risks to the public, Court personnel, and the orderly administration of justice, the Court finds that closure of certain Court locations is warranted. Accordingly, it is now **ORDERED** that the Evansville Federal Courthouse located at at 101 Northwest MLK Jr., Blvd, Evansville, Indiana 47708, is **CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC effective at 5:00**


